Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 16, 2024

Congratulations to all our fathers on Father's Day this Sunday. We appreciate all that our fathers, living or deceased, have done for us in helping us to grow into mature & responsible adults. We remember all of them in our prayers this weekens





We congratulate Fr. Joe Nelson who celebrated his 60th anniversary of Ordination at the 10 AM Mass this past Sunday. That was followed by a great luncheon provided by the Knights of St. John. Several friars and Secular Franciscans from Cincinnati joined us for this celebration. We thank all who worked hard to decorate the cafeteria for the occasion, all who helped serve the meal, and all who cleaned up afterwards.

On this weekend our Scriptures are all about God's power and care for us and

our earth. The first reading from Ezekiel gives us an example of God planting a cedar on a high mountain. It grows majestic and bears fruit & a variety of birds dwell in it. All the trees will know that God is in charge of His creation. St. Paul writes to the Corinthians emphasizing the importance of faith: "We walk by faith, not by sight." Our goal in life is to please the Lord, realizing that our life's eternal destiny is to be with the Lord.





In St. Mark's Gospel passage, Jesus uses an agricultural example to describe the Kingdom of God. He describes how seeds sprout and grow almost automatically, under God's care, and yield their fruit at the proper time. More specifically, mustard seeds, the smallest of all seeds, grow into large plants that the birds can dwell in. That is also the way the Kingdom of God grows. We must

do our part, but God is really behind all growth, both on earth and in our spiritual lives. Are you conscious of the need for you to respond to God's grace in your life so that you may grow spiritually? What are the gifts God gives you to help your spiritual growth? How do you cooperate with God and His Son Jesus in bringing about your spiritual growth?

Please keep me in your prayers this week while I am away for a week's silent retreat in upstate New York at a Franciscan retreat center called Mount Irenaeus. You'll be in my thoughts and prayers in a special way this week as well!
