

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 23, 2024


I hope everyone had an enjoyable Father's Day in spite of the high temperatures. It is always good to celebrate our Fathers, living and deceased, for their love and care and good examples. We wouldn't exist without them!

Our Scriptures for this weekend emphasize God's power over the forces of nature. In the reading from Job we hear the Lord speak to Job about His ability to control the wrath of storms at sea as well as the clouds and darkness of daily life. St. Paul, writing to the Corinthians, speaks of the love of Christ for all people. Jesus died for all so that we may live for Him. We are no longer on our own, the old things



(sinfulness) have passed away. Now new things (graces) have come to us and we are a new creation because of our Baptisms and faith in Jesus.

Our Gospel from St. Mark tells about Jesus and the disciples crossing the



Sea of Galilee at night. When a violent squall came up and Jesus was asleep in the boat, His disciples woke Him and He calmed the sea. Jesus asked them why they were worried, did they not have faith? They were amazed at Jesus' power, even over the wind and sea. How do you understand Jesus' power over nature? What is the purpose of this Gospel story? Is Jesus a powerful person over your spiritual life as

well as your daily life? How do you cope with the problems and challenges of your daily life?






