Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 30, 2024

I hope you all enjoyed the Summer Bash this past Saturday with its parade and games and food, in spite of the extra hot weather! I was on the road returning from my week's retreat at Mt. Irenaeus in upstate New York, near St. Bonaventure University. I had a good week praying and meditating & enjoying



the peace and quiet of nature and the hospitality of the friars living and visiting there. I'll be leaving for vacation Monday, July 1, for 2 weeks to visit my sisters and their families in Missoula, Montana, and Half Moon Bay, California. I plan to return in time for Freudenfest and to continue packing my stuff.

Our first reading this weekend is from the beginning of the Book of Wisdom. It describes God's creation as being good in all cases. Humans were created in God's image, and death only entered the world by the envy of the devil. St. Paul writes to the Corinthians to encourage them to be generous and to use their abundance to help the needs of the poor. Just as Jesus became poor for us, so we should be willing to become poor for others.

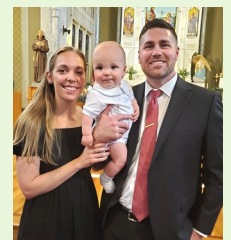
Our Gospel from St. Mark gives us a miracle within a miracle. When Jairus, a synagogue official, asked Jesus to come and heal his daughter, Jesus agreed and went with Jairus. On the way, a woman afflicted with a years-long hemorrhage who had no satisfaction from many doctors, touched Jesus' cloak expecting to be healed.



Jesus felt power go out from Him and asked who touched him. The woman who was healed, knelt in fear and trembling before Jesus and He praised her faith in Him. Still on His way to the synagogue official's house, Jesus was told that it was too late and the girl had already died. Jesus said to just have

faith and went to the official's house where there was weeping and wailing. Taking the girl's father and mother into the room, Jesus took the girl by the hand and called for her to arise. She got up immediately and walked around to the amazement of all, and Jesus told them to give her some food. **How do these everyday miracles speak to you about Jesus' power? Do you invite Jesus into your life in the same way when you are suffering and in need? What is the difference between then and now?**

New Indiana report: 98% fewer babies aborted Indiana in first quarter 2024 compared to the same period in 2023

The Indiana Department of Health on Friday released its official abortion report for the first quarter of 2024. The report shows 98% decrease in abortions in the first quarter of 2024 (45 abortions) compared to the first quarter of 2023 (1,931 abortions). Indiana's new abortion law SEA1 was

blocked by an injunction through most of 2023.

Key takeaways from the report include:

- 58 % of reported abortions (26) are induced by abortion drugs.
- The majority of abortions (22) were done between 14 and 20 weeks; 12 abortions are reported at 21 weeks or later.
- 62% of the reported abortions (28) listed lethal fetal anomaly as the cause; one abortion was listed as a result of rape.
- The vast majority of reported abortions are reported as being done at Indianapolis' Riley Health Maternity Tower (22 or 49%) and Sidney & Lois Eskenazi Hospital (14 or 31%)

All reported statistics are currently unverifiable by public review due to the state's blockage of access to properly redacted abortion report forms.
