## **Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections** Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 21, 2024

This past week was a busy one, with the Vacation Bible School from Monday to Thursday, the Eucharistic Revival Congress in Indianapolis from Wednesday to this Sunday, and the Freudenfest this past Friday and Saturday. Next weekend we have the Rummage Sale on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Lots of activity and noise and work has been going on and will continue.



Thanks to all our volunteers and staff who give so much of their time and talent to make this all happen! I arranged my vacation so that I could be back in Oldenburg to participate in everything, one way or another.

In our first Scripture reading this weekend, Jeremiah is critical of the shepherds (leaders) who have mislead and scattered God's people. God says He will take care



of the people and gather the remnant from all the lands where they have been scattered. He will appoint shepherds who will care for the people. A day is coming when a new leader will be raised up who will govern Israel and Judah justly. In the second reading St. Paul writes to the Ephesians about how Christ is their peace
