

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 4, 2024

Thanks to all who worked so hard over the past months preparing and setting up for our annual Rummage Sale, July 26 to 28. Thanks to all who donated items for the Rummage Sale and those who purchased their choice items. According to our reports, this Rummage Sale brought in record profits for our Religious Education Program, over \$30,000. Congratulations to the Committee and to all the Workers!





Thanks also to all who donated to our annual Missionary Appeal this past weekend. Fr. Severine Msigiti made a great appeal for his Diocese of Tanga & his seminarians who are studying for the priesthood in Tanzania. Donations totaled over \$2000. May God bless the seminarians and all our donors.

Our Scriptures for this weekend again emphasize God's concern & compassion

for His people. Our first reading from Exodus reminds us of how God provided food for the Israelites when they were in the desert escaping from the Egyptians. They complained to Moses and God, longing for the food back in Egypt. The Lord provided quail and manna to satisfy their hunger, one day at a time. St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians reminds them that they are not to live sinful lives as of old, but to be



renewed in mind and spirit as he had taught them. They are to put on the new self of righteousness and truth by believing in Jesus and living that belief.

St. John's Gospel tells of the people's response after Jesus had fed them with the loaves and the fishes. Rather than working for food that perishes, they are to



do the works of God by believing in Jesus. He is the true bread from heaven that gives life to the world and comes from God. Jesus concludes by telling them: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst." How do you respond to Jesus' promise of everlasting life by eating His Body and Blood in Communion? Do you believe that Jesus really gives us His Body and Blood as the National Eucharistic Congress reminded us? Do you just rush out of church

without even taking time to thank Jesus after Communion? How do you prepare for Holy Communion?

Eucharistic Ministers assist with the distribution of the Sacred Body and Precious Blood of Christ at all masses. You will MINISTERS need to attend a training.



Lectors: Lectors make the Living Word of God present by their proclamation during the Liturgy of the Word. They are trained to help the congregation to better understand the scripture & to successfully communicate the
