



# Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 20, 2023

Our readings this week focus on justice and mercy. Isaiah reminds the people that the Lord stands for doing what is right and just. God's love and mercy are for all

people, all nations, calling all to minister in the name of the Lord, keeping the Sabbath regulations, and obeying the covenant. In that way their offerings and sacrifices will be acceptable at the Lord's altar. St. Paul's Letter to the Romans is addressed to the Gentiles, since Paul is the apostle to the Gentiles, but He is challenging his own Jewish people to



be faithful, too. He wants everyone to be saved in Jesus. God's gifts and call should not be forgotten by anyone. God loves everyone, and wishes all to be saved. He wants to have mercy on all people, Jews and Gentiles alike.

In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus goes to the pagan region of Tyre and Sidon. A Canaanite woman approaches Jesus, seeking healing for her daughter. The disciples




want Jesus to send her away because she is bothering them. Instead, Jesus responds to her request, after proclaiming that He was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel. Jesus says it is not right to throw the children's food (His mercy) to the dogs (Gentiles). But she turns the tables and says that even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table. Jesus praises her faith & heals her daughter. Like Jesus, we are challenged to go beyond our little circle and respond to the needs of all people, even ones who are not like us. How can we be more generous and

compassionate this week to all peoples who are in need? Have you donated recently to the Food Pantry or to the Pregnancy Hotline or other local or world-wide charities?

The Parish Council met recently and recommended that the Precious Blood at Mass be distributed by just 2 Ministers, rather than the presently scheduled 4 people. This change will go into effect in the near future, relieving the pressure on Eucharist Ministers to serve so frequently. We also learned that our new crèche statues of

Jesus, the Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph, will soon be delivered to Holy Family Church. The Freudenfest Committee agreed to pay half the cost of these new figures. We also reviewed the costs of getting married at Holy Family Church, and are in the process of gathering information from our neighboring parishes. We are seeking nominations for new candidates for



our Parish Council elections that take place in October. The Council meets once a month, and the term of office is 3 years. If you would like to nominate yourself or someone else for this Parish Council ministry, please contact me as soon as possible.






