

## Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time August 25, 2024

Congratulations to Father John Barker who was ordained to the Priesthood on Friday, August 23, by Archbishop Charles Thompson at the 4 PM ordination Mass, with the dinner reception following in our school cafeteria. Fr. John celebrates his First Mass of Thanksgiving this Sunday, August 25, at the 10 AM Mass. Thanks to Archbishop Thompson who did the ordaining on Friday, and to our staff and volunteers who



prepared the decorations and served the celebratory dinner. Fr. John is now the official pastor of Holy Family Parish. May the Lord bless him in this new position.

Our Scriptures for this 21st Sunday emphasize commitment and loyalty to God and to Jesus. In the first reading, Joshua appeals to all the tribes of Israel to



decide whom they will serve, the pagan gods or the Lord. The people renewed their commitment to the Lord who brought them out of slavery in Egypt and fed and protected them in the desert. In the second reading St. Paul challenges the Ephesians and us to reverence and respect each other. He reminds them

and us that husbands and wives are to love and cherish and sacrifice for each other as Christ does for the Church. Marital love is symbolic of Jesus' love for His people the Church.

In John's Gospel we continue to hear Jesus' Bread of Life discourse. People found it hard to understand and accept Jesus' claim that he is God's Son come

among them from heaven. "The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life," Jesus proclaims. Some disciples could not accept Jesus' teaching and went back to their former way of life. Speaking for the Twelve, Peter said, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Do you believe that Jesus has the Words



of eternal life? How do you put this belief into practice in your daily life? Do you follow Jesus' example of love and compassion, and come to the Eucharist for your nourishment?






