
Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 10, 2023

I hope you all had a good Labor Day celebration, marking the end of Summer. I remember as a kid asking my Dad if we could have the day off from our home building efforts to celebrate Labor Day. He would say that it is **Labor Day**, and we should be working on that day, since we all would be back in school in a day or two. As you know, in the good old days, school didn't start until after Labor Day!



This week our Scriptures are all about fraternal correction, trying to help our friends and family to live according to God's teachings. The Prophet Ezekiel



reveals that God has appointed him to speak God's word to the Israelites. He is to try to get the wicked to change their ways. It will be a challenge, but God will be pleased if the prophet succeeds in this task. St. Paul, writing to the Romans, takes a different tack. He positively encourages the people to love one another commandments. All the commandments are summed

and thus to fulfill all the commandments. All the commandments are summed up in "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus challenges all who have been offended to speak to their brother or sister one-to-one, pointing out the offense. If they

don't respond to your efforts, seek a couple other people to support your testimony. If that doesn't work, ask the help of the faith community. Only if that doesn't work, then you can give up and take your efforts elsewhere. We have the power of binding and loosing, but the important thing is to do our best in a gentle and compassionate way. Jesus goes on to say that we can pray for what we need, and Jesus promises to be with those gathered in prayer. So we



are challenged to be prayerful, honest and compassionate at the same time. We can condemn the sin but not the sinner. This is a challenge for outspoken people and shy people alike. Following Jesus is not always easy! How can we put this into action this week?


