

Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works. (James 2:18)

Christian discipleship is all about becoming more like Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. As we come increasingly to see and respond to the world the way Jesus does, we find that we are more and more drawn to care for others as Jesus does. On the night before He died, Jesus washed

His disciples' feet and told them - told all of us: love one another as I have loved you. As the song says, "they will know we are Christians by our love."

This is why Saint James says that our faith – our relationship with Christ – can never be just about us and Jesus. A "faith" that does not expand our circle of care is no faith at all; in fact, it is dead (James 2:17, 26). Jesus says we can know a tree by its fruit (Luke 6:44). Just so, we can know the health of our faith by how concerned we are to help those in need.

There are many kinds of needs of the body and of the soul. To meet them, our Catholic tradition recognizes "corporal" and "spiritual" works of mercy – all derived from Scripture. Saint James encourages us to give witness to our faith through corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit prisoners, bury the dead, or give alms to the poor.

This week, consider how you can live your faith by taking on a corporal work of mercy. It doesn't have to be much, but it will help someone who struggles. We might also want to think in terms of our faith community. In the coming weeks, I'll be asking to hear your ideas for developing a new *parish ministry* (or maybe more than one!) that reaches out to those in need. So be thinking about that, too.
