

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 25, 2023

This week's Scriptures continue to emphasize God's generous love and mercy. Isaiah's prophecy contains some of the most memorable

Isaiah's prophecy contains some of the most memorable lines about our loving God: "For my thoughts and not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." God continues to challenge us! St. Paul writes



to the Philippians regarding his earthly ministry. Paul would like to be with Christ in heaven, yet he knows that he has more work to do here on earth for the benefit of his people. He encourages them to live in a way worthy of the Gospel.

In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells the powerful parable about God's generosity



to His people. In the parable of the vineyard, Jesus tells of the landowner who hires workers at various times of the day. At evening time, all are paid the same daily wage, whether they worked one hour or the whole day. At first sight, it seems unfair to those who bore the heat of the day, to be paid the same as the one-hour workers. But the point of the parable is that God is very generous. Everyone gets the usual daily wage; no one is cheated. That's the way it is with God: "the last will be first, and the first will be last." We all get much more grace than we deserve!

At our Parish Council Meeting last week, a good number of names were suggested as possible candidates for our upcoming Parish Council election in October. I am in the process of contacting these people to invite them to be on our Parish Council ballot. If you get a call, please be generous with your time and agree to run! We need good candidates for our upcoming election and our future!





Tom Ricke and Linda Weigel from St. Mary Parish in Greensburg went on a Food For The Poor mission trip to Honduras in May. The purpose of the trip was to learn how FFTP helps the Honduran people. We were able to see firsthand the poverty of the area which is second only to Haiti in the western hemisphere. FFTP not only provides houses for folks but gives them education so they can sustain themselves by learning a trade such as fishing, sewing, or welding, etc. They assess the needs of the people in the villages and build the infrastructure

(electricity, clean water, proper sewage) and then build a community center. After that, the concrete houses are built to sustain the hurricane winds and rain. St. Mary has adopted a village in Cucuyagua. The people are living on mountainsides without safe water & toilets. The mayor and city council has donated prime land on a mountain plateau for their new village which will house 52 families. Please join us in our efforts to bring them out of poverty into a new life.
