# HOLY FAMILY PARISH

*"Remember that you received what was good during your lifetime..." (Luke 16:25)*

Of all the Gospel writers, Saint Luke emphasizes Jesus' teaching about the dangers of worldly wealth the most. This is probably because he wrote his Gospel for Christians who were of Gentile (pagan) origin, many of whom were well-to-do. These new Christians, who were not raised with the Jewish emphasis on care for the poor and the spiritual dangers of wealth, needed to hear especially Jesus' instructions and warnings in this regard.

And so we find in the Gospel according to Luke, Jesus teaching that those who can afford to give nice parties should take care to share their generosity with those who cannot return it (we heard that four Sundays ago); that you cannot serve both God and wealth, and so should use our wealth to help others (last Sunday); and that there are eternal consequences for the comfortable who ignore the plight of the poor right at their literal or figurative door (this week).

It is not that Jesus condemns the wealthy, or the comfortably well off, simply because they have money. He does condemn them when they live out their cozy lives without any concern for the needs of others. The Bible consistently and persistently – from beginning to end – emphasizes that the gifts God has given us are meant to be shared, not hoarded. This includes spiritual gifts and material gifts. Our Catholic tradition also emphasizes that care of the poor is an obligation, not an option. In fact, it was the early Christians who astounded the world that Luke's new Christians came from by actively caring for the needy, giving them food, shelter, clothing, medical care, and anything else they could. This is how we follow Christ and imitate Him.

Let's consider what each of us can do to help others by sharing our good fortune. If we already do that, may God continue to bless us so we can be a blessing for others. If we do not – or could do more – may God guide and inspire us to make sacrifices so that others can simply live dignified lives.

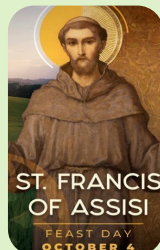
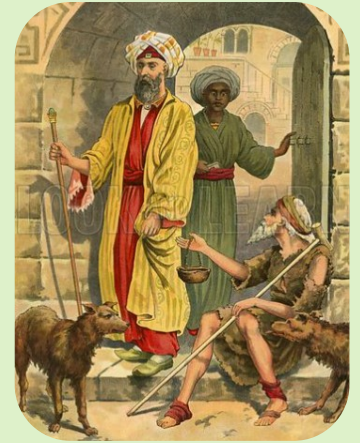
### Please Pray for Michael Biltz
