

The word of God is living and effective. (Hebrews 4:12)

God speaks to us in many ways: through His creation ("the heavens are telling the glory of God!"); through the big and small events of our lives; in our relationships; through our Catholic Tradition, handed down to us through the ages; through preaching and the wisdom of the saints. Most especially we cherish the word of God we hear in Sacred Scripture.

The Bible can be very confusing. Written long ago by people who led lives that were very different from ours, we find in Scripture ways of talking about God, or the world, that can be obscure and even off-putting. But as old and foreign sounding as the letter of

Scripture may be, it is nevertheless "living and effective" because it is the word of the living God breathed forth by the Holy Spirit, "ever ancient, ever new." Through Scripture we come to know a God who created us for glory, who challenges us to grow into His likeness through His grace, who has sent His Son and His Spirit so that we can be the salt of the earth and the light of the world, heralds of the Good News of God's salvation.

Some of you may want to learn more about how God's word can be living and effective in your life, but don't know where to begin. One great resource is the podcast by Fr. Mike Schmitz called "The Bible in a Year." Father Schmitz provides a reliable, relatable, and engaging walk through the entire Bible for those who want to bring the word of God more fully into their lives. The podcast is available on all the usual platforms. (You might also like his "The Catechism in a Year" podcast.)

This week consider the role of Scripture in your life right now, and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to a deeper engagement with God's word so that it can be living and effective in your life.

Family Listening Sessions




