

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 15, 2023

Our Scriptures this weekend are linked together by the theme of a banquet. The Prophet Isaiah uses the image to describe how God cares for His people,

providing them with rich food and choice wine. God wants the best for His people on the mountain of Zion (Jerusalem), wiping away their tears and destroying death forever. It reminds us of the war going on now between the Palestinian Hamas and the Israelites. Both sides want to exist in peace, but both want the same land as their own. Isaiah says that God will save His people; they (we) just have to look to Him with hope and trust. We must pray for peace & reconciliation between both sides, that is the ultimate meaning of the



heavenly banquet. In the second reading St. Paul is reflecting on his life as he is saying farewell to the Philippians from prison. Paul points to his flexibility in terms of living well or humbly, being well fed or going hungry. He goes on to say that God will supply whatever we need as long as we trust in Him and let go of our selfish concerns and desires.



In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus uses the image of a wedding feast that a king gives for his son. When the banquet was ready, those invited refused to come, even after multiple reminders. The servants were mistreated and killed. The people had other priorities—their farms or businesses. (Thus they chose not to come.) So the king invited all other kinds of people to the banquet. Even though the fancy clothes were provided for them, one quest chose to come in to the

banquet without the proper wedding garment. God cares very much for all His people and all of creation, but we must choose to accept His invitation. God does not force us to do His will or accept His grace. Jesus died for us, but we must accept His grace on His terms. What choices will you make this week?

Thanks to all who accepted the invitation to be Candidates on our Parish Council ballot later this month. The Parish Council reviewed their statements at our meeting.




