We Catholics hold the Eucharist at the center of our lives. Even though our human senses perceive bread and wine, the Eucharist is Jesus—body, blood, soul, and divinity. In a similar way, the sanctity of human life often lies hidden beneath the guise of a “mass of cells” in the womb, in the seriously ill or dying, in the imprisoned, in those who struggle with addiction, mental illness, depression, or despair. In every instance where any human life is threatened or diminished, we are called to help others recognize the absolutely

sacred life that may not be perceivable through our natural senses. We need to help others understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not important.

We live in a society that rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable. Yet, it is precisely within these conditions that a person is most in need of our care and protection. As Pope St. John Paul II wrote, “we are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the ‘culture of death’ and the ‘culture of life’. . .we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life.”

In the face of challenges such as abortion, widespread depression and despair, addiction, and physician-assisted suicide, we may feel that we are not equal to the task of overcoming the darkness. Yet, we are not alone. Jesus tells us, “I am with you always, until the end of the age” (Matthew 28:20). The God who became man to save us still dwells among us. For Christ is “the light [that] shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it” (John 1:5). He is the one who overcame death and continually raises us to new life. He remains close to us always, seeking us out in each moment of our lives.

Jesus gave his very flesh to give us the gift of eternal life and invites us to the most profound experience of this gift in our celebration of the Eucharist. When we meet Jesus in the Eucharist, this encounter has the power to change us, if we resolve to give ourselves to Him as He gives Himself to us, if we commit ourselves to life as He does.

Please consider setting aside one hour a week to pray with our Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament, for a conversion of minds and hearts away from a culture of death and toward a culture of life – that every person may come to recognize, respect, and defend the sacredness of life in all its forms and under all its hidden guises, especially the weak, the fragile, and the vulnerable. You can find Him at any hour of the day or night in any Catholic church.

Did You Know? At 6 weeks a preborn baby is NOT just a clump of cells. According to Dr. Tara Sander Lee, senior fellow and director of life sciences at the nonprofit Charlotte Lozier Institute, "A preborn baby's heart is actively beating at 6 weeks and will have already beat nearly 16 million times by 15 weeks. In fact, at 6 weeks' gestation, the baby's heart rate is about 110 beats per minute, which can be easily detected by ultrasound."
