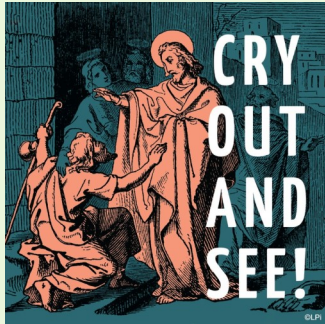

Master, I want to see. (Mark 10:51)

On His way to Jerusalem, Jesus encounters Bartimaeus, a blind man. Bartimaeus cries out to Him for help. In answer to his request for sight, Jesus announces to him that "your faith has saved you." Because he believed that Jesus could heal him, he was able to receive the gift of wholeness, the gift of salvation.

Sight is not just a physical sense. Sight is also a spiritual sense. When we are "clear sighted" we see things as they

are, we understand the truth of reality and the truth of our own lives. We might even say that with 20/20 spiritual sight we approach the ability to see things as God sees them. We see other people not as problems to be avoided or solved, but as fellow strugglers in life who are often doing the best they can. We recognize that we are flawed and even sinful, but beloved children of God nevertheless. We see God as mercifully just, determined to set all things right by bringing healing and freedom to all the world. With good spiritual sight we can see in Technicolor the truth, the beauty, and the goodness of God and His creation and rejoice in all of it.

This week call to Jesus as Bartimaeus does. Ask Him to show you your spiritual blindspots, the ways you fail to see and appreciate the wonder of God, the dignity of every other person, and the beauty of your own soul. Tell Jesus you want to see as He sees. Have the courage and faith to receive His sight and to walk in His light.



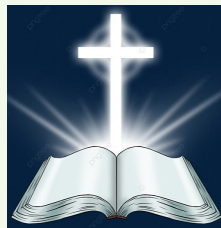

Celebrating Our Faith

All Saints Day
November 1



Question: Why do we pray to the saints? Why can't we just pray to Jesus?

Answer: Well, in the first place, we CAN go straight to Jesus. We pray to Jesus and through Jesus all the time, even in the Litany of the Saints! We Catholics don't HAVE to pray to the saints, we just think it's a good idea, and not because we don't think Jesus' help is sufficient. It is, absolutely.

Why go to the saints, then? The same reason we ask our friends and family to pray for us. In his letters, Saint Paul is constantly talking about how he prays for others and asks them to pray for him. The Letter of Saint James tells us to "pray for one another.... The fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful" (5:16). It is a very Christian thing to pray for others, and who is more righteous than the saints?

So, if our friends and family on earth can pray for us, why can't the saints in heaven pray for us? They are still members of the body of Christ, the Church, and so they are our brothers and sisters in Christ - and they want to help us with their prayers. This is one of the ways they continue to give glory to God, the Giver of all good gifts. To pray for others is an act of LOVE, and no one loves more than the saints. That's why they're saints!



Who's your favorite saint?

"The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint."

The French Catholic Leon Bloy wrote this, and it's true! When it comes down to it, being a saint is nothing more than being the person God created you to be, becoming "the best version of yourself." Why would we want anything else? What else is there? What's stopping you from letting God make you a saint?

All Souls Day November 2

Did you know...

on each of the days between November 1 and 8, you can obtain a plenary indulgence by praying for the dead in a cemetery (and a partial indulgence any other day of the year)? More on indulgences next week...

Question: Why do Catholics pray for the dead?

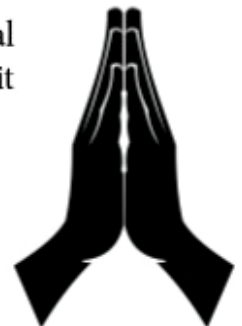
Answer: We Catholics believe that we remain in communion with those who have gone before us. Some, the ones we call saints, had already been so completely transformed by grace in this life that they achieved glory right away. Others were like most of us at their passing: on the way, but not there yet because there was still some work to be done by the Holy Spirit to make them ready for eternal life in the glorious presence of the Holy Trinity. It is these that we call the "holy souls" in purgatory.

All through November we keep our Book of Remembrance in the church by the Pearl Street entrance. Please pray for those who are in the book, and be sure to add the names of your own loved ones who have passed away so that the whole parish can pray for them.

Before Christ, Jews prayed and offered sacrifices on behalf of the dead, as we find in the Book of Maccabees: "Therefore Judas Maccabeus made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin" (2 Macc 12:46). From the beginning, the Church has likewise offered prayers and sacrifice - above all the most important Sacrifice of the Mass - to speed the dead to their final glory. It is a Spiritual Work of Mercy to pray for the living and the dead. One of the most loving things we can do is pray for those who cannot now pray for themselves and to offer sacrifices for them (in the form of almsgiving or fasting or the Mass, for example).

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Consider learning this traditional prayer for the dead and making it a regular part of your prayers. Many people pray it when they say grace at the end of meals. Maybe you can do that at your house!

Respect Life Month - October - Mental Health Ministry

St. John of God (15th century, Spain) is a patron saint for those who live with mental illness and face mental health challenges. In his mid-life, St. John was perceived, perhaps wrongly, as having a mental illness, and was sent to a psychiatric facility where he experienced horrific treatment. In response to his experience there, he prayed that "those suffering from mental disorders might have refuge and that I may be able to serve them as I wish" (Francisco de Castro, Historia, 1585). St. John subsequently dedicated himself to ministering to the poor, sick, and people living with mental illness.

PRAY... Lord, we pray that our brothers and sisters who suffer from mental illness and mental health challenges, and those who support them, are never alone or discriminated against, but instead are welcomed and supported in the Church.

We pray that mental health ministry becomes an integral ministry in the Church, and that every Catholic parish and community might have access to mental health ministries.

We pray that mental health ministries will help build communities of warmth and affection where those who face mental health challenges will, in the words of Pope Francis, "find support and a light that opens them up to life."

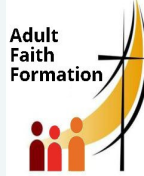
