
Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 5, 2023

Congratulations to our four new Parish Council members elected last weekend: Marcia Bischoff, Carla Enzinger, Mike Gehring, and Steve Kerker. Our next meeting will be on November 14, at 7 PM in the Fr. Rudolf Room. May you serve our Holy Family Parish with enthusiasm and generosity! You are in our thoughts and prayers. May the Lord bless you greatly during these next 3 years.

I hope you all had a good Halloween with lots of costumes and candy. This holiday is a preparation for the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls which we recently

celebrated. November is the month in which we celebrate all who have gone before us, those is heaven and those waiting to enter heaven. We Catholics believe in celebrating the saints for their holiness and their good example for us. We also believe in praying for those who have died and gone before us believing in God's mercy and



compassion. Our Book of Remembrance will be on display all during November so you can list your deceased loved ones and friends for our community's prayers.

In our first reading from the Prophet Malachi today, we hear God criticizing the people for not being faithful to the Covenant of their ancestors. They have sinned by turning away from God and by giving false teachings and bad example. They have gone their own way, breaking faith with each other. In our second reading, St. Paul continues to write to the Thessalonians, professing his love and care for them. He



describes his selfless efforts of evangelization, and praises their openness to God's good news. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells the people to observe the teachings of the Scribes and Pharisees, but not their example of selfishness and pride. They just want to be seen as holy people, seeking honors and

privileges, without helping the ordinary people in their struggles. Jesus warns his followers not to seek fancy titles or special honors. Rather, they must become servants to the rest, humbling themselves before others as Jesus did when He washed the feet of His disciples at the Last Supper. What is our approach to serving others, or do we expect to be served all the time? Spend some time this week

reflecting on your attitude towards serving others, and deciding how you will put other people first in the future!
