Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 12, 2023

Thanks to all who returned your United Catholic Appeal intention cards to our office during the past several weeks, or will soon return them with your pledge or check. Each



year we are challenged to donate a certain amount, this year it is \$32,603, as our part of the Archdiocese's goal of \$6.3 million. The money goes to support many different projects and charities in the Archdiocese, such as seminary costs, Catholic Charities support, diocesan

Our Scriptures this weekend extol the importance of wisdom in all our daily activities and endeavors. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom sings the beauty and practicality of the pursuit of wisdom in our lives. Wisdom is waiting for us if we are alert and aware. She is found in many areas if we are watching for her. Wisdom is the perfection of prudence and helps us be free from care. Our second reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians wisely reassures us that God is with all those who

have died, as well as with those still living. The people were concerned about the Second Coming of Jesus, and didn't want to be left behind. St. Paul says the Lord Himself will come down and take those who have died to be with Him in heaven. Then those who are alive likewise will meet the Lord. All believers should be consoled with this good news about Jesus' love and mercy.

In today's Gospel from St. Matthew, Jesus tells a parable about 10 virgins awaiting the wedding party. The 5 wise ones brought oil for their lamps, while the other 5



did not bring extra oil. When the wedding party was delayed, all their lamps were going out, but the wise ones had extra oil. The foolish ones begged for some oil from the wise ones, but were told to go a buy their own. While they were gone, the wedding party arrived, and the wise ones trimmed their lamps and welcomed the guests. When the other 5 returned, they were too late because the doors to the reception hall were closed. The oil stands for our daily love and generosity. Jesus is telling us to be prepared at all



times, because we don't know when the final time will come, either the end of our lives or the end of the world. Are we living like Jesus may be coming at any time? Are we prepared to join Him, or are we procrastinating and delaying like the other 5 foolish ones? Let's change and become wise so we are ready when Jesus comes.
