...she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had... (Mark 12:44)

This week we have two widows, each with very little, but generous with what she does have. The widow in Zarephath has only a handful of flour and a little oil to feed herself and her son. The widow in the Gospel has only a couple of small coins. Yet each is willing to give away all she has to God's prophet, or to the temple – that is, to God.

The widow in Zarephath could have refused to give Elijah anything, claiming simply that she needed it for herself. And the widow at the temple would have been perfectly justified if she had put only one coin – or even no coins – in the temple

treasury. But each showed by her actions that she trusted God to provide for her.

Every day we are invited by God to be generous with Him. A great example of this is prayer. Many of us are very busy with work, school, family. Finding even five minutes can be a challenge. On the one hand, it seems like a lot of time to sit quietly with God when there is so much to do. On the other hand, five minutes hardly seems worth bothering with, it's so little. What good will five minutes with God do? Well, leave that to God. If we want to be disciples of Jesus, we have to spend time with Him. Rummage around and find two small coins – just five minutes – and see what Jesus can do with them. (If you can manage ten, give Him that.)

Wondering what to do for those five minutes? Pray the Our Father slowly and mean every

word of it; pray for the things you think you need, the people you love, those who are suffering; tell God you don't know what to do and ask Him to help. Don't worry too much about what to do. The point is to give, like the widow, to God what you have as a gesture of love and a desire to know Him better. Just put in your two small coins – and not just once: every day! – and see what happens.


CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

The Catholic Church teaches the fundamental importance of paying workers a living wage that allows them to meet their basic needs. Cooperative businesses are co-owned by the employees, which gives workers greater say in how the business is run, including the wages and salaries that workers earn. Those principles animate the work of the organizations creating opportunities and fighting poverty with support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).

Seed Commons is a New York City–based national network of community loan funds that make cooperative businesses easier to start and less expensive than obtaining bank loans. Based on a "nonextractive" model, Seed Commons does not require borrowers to make payments on interest or principal until they can cover operating expenses, including market-rate salaries. With support from CCHD, Seed Commons helps workers become cooperative owners who earn living wages at companies like a Chicago-based window manufacturer, which pays \$2/hour more than it did before it became a cooperative. The employee-owners now earn not only higher wages but profit-sharing checks as well.

Your support of CCHD helps workers become worker-owners who earn living wages and establish economic roots in communities that badly need greater employment and earning opportunities. When you give to the CCHD collection, you help not only national networks like Seed Commons but also organizations working to end poverty within your diocese, where 25% of your contribution stays to create opportunities in your own neighborhood.




