Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 19, 2023

This week we celebrate Thanksgiving Day on Thursday, November 23. It is always a good time for a celebration, as we move into the Autumn season and have

our fruitful harvests and many other reasons to celebrate. We give thanks to God for our families and friends, for our parish and community. We will have our Thanksgiving Day Mass at 8 AM that morning, celebrating the Eucharist which means "thanksgiving" in

which Jesus gives us His Body and Blood for our food. We want to have an attitude of gratitude for all our blessings, realizing that everything we have comes from God.

Our Scriptures on this 33rd Sunday speak to us of the importance of recognizing and being thankful for the gifts we have received from God. Husbands, the first reading from the Book of Proverbs celebrates the blessings of a worthy wife. We are given many reasons to be grateful, and after pointing out these many positive

reasons, the reading reminds wives to remain humble in the sight of God. St. Paul writes to the Thessalonians, reminding them that no one knows when the Lord will return. They are "children of the light," so they and we are to stay sober and alert, ready to meet our God when He comes.

St. Matthew's Gospel again recounts one of Jesus' parables. This one is about a man going on a journey, who entrusts his 3 servants with a certain amount of money. Each is expected to invest it and gain more. Two of them double their money and receive the master's approval, but the third one buries his money because he fears his master. The master rewards the first 2 men with more responsibility,

but punishes the third for being afraid and burying the money to safeguard it. We are each gifted with many talents and skills and blessings, and are called to use them for the good of our family, Church, and community. Let us not be fearful and bury our gifts, but rather be willing to be creative and take a risk to make the best of our God-given gifts. Let's not be wicked, lazy servants, but generous, unselfish ones. Often we don't know what we are capable of until we give it a shot, trusting in the Lord! How will you use your gifts this week?




