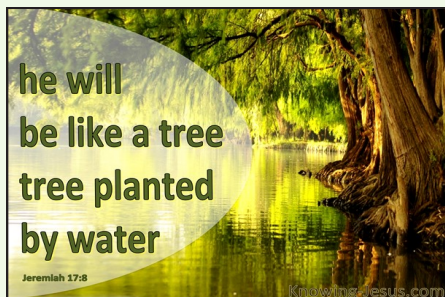

Jeremiah 17:8

"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord..." (Jeremiah 17:7)

Scripture this week draws a stark contrast between two different ways of living. Through the prophet Jeremiah, the Lord pronounces that to turn our hearts away from the Lord, and instead to put our trust in human beings, is to live a barren, cursed life. Such a "life" has lost contact with the Source of life. On the other hand, those who

treasure their relationship with God are fully alive. They remain in touch with the waters of life.

Jeremiah was speaking about a particular situation at his time. The kingdom of Judah, where he lived, was being threatened by the powerful Babylonian Empire. In response, the king and leaders of Judah were seeking protection by making military alliances with powerful states like Egypt. The Lord complains that they are leaning on human beings to save them rather than turning back to Him. In fact, it is because of their infidelity to God that the Babylonians are threatening Judah in the first place. Rather than repair their relationship with God, the source of their life, they are depending on "flesh" to be their strength.

Although we don't have to worry about Babylon these days, we, too, can find ourselves turning to human means to solve problems that find their source in a lukewarm or non-existent relationship with God. For example, many people today have no sense of a transcendent purpose to their life, no meaning beyond day to day or year by year getting by. They don't know what their lives are about, and so making as much money, having as much fun, getting as much stuff, as they can is practically the whole point of their existence. Or they just waste their lives by moving from one meaningless distraction to another, most of them courtesy of their smart phone and internet connection. Our culture nurtures this by feeding us hours and hours of empty entertainment that neither inspires nor uplifts our hearts, neither nourishes nor develops our souls. All it really does is help us "kill time" while enriching the providers of spiritual junk food. Even people of faith can fall into the trap, losing much of our lives to meaningless distractions or the pursuit of fleeting treasures.

Jeremiah reminds us that our relationship with God – our understanding of our Faith and our struggle to live it faithfully – is what gives our lives meaning, purpose, and value. We who have been baptized share our life with God in a special way and so our lives ought to be about letting that divine life bloom as fully as possible. How? By letting God teach us and shape us by His grace into becoming more and more children in His image – merciful as He is merciful, just as He is just, and loving and generous as He is loving and generous. This is what gives us life. This is a worthy pursuit, a noble use of our time.

So, we should ask ourselves: am I fully receiving the gift of life God wants me to have by living as a disciple of Christ 24/7? Or am I letting the fleeting, often completely trivial, things of this world take over large chunks of my life? Is my heart turned fully toward the Lord, or do I find the source of my life somewhere else, even without realizing I am doing it?

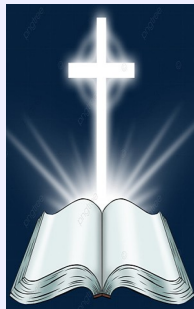

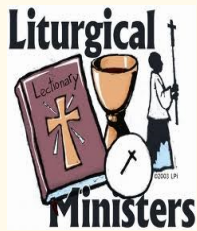

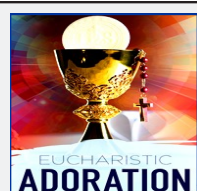
