Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections Divine Mercy Sunday April 7, 2024

special Masses and Services. Your Easter participation was outstanding!


Our first reading on this Divine Mercy Sunday is from the Acts of the Apostles and describes the early community after the Resurrection. It is idealized to some

No Request is too *Audacious* for God. degree, making everything sound so ideal. The apostles preached and taught, bearing witness to the risen Jesus. All were generous and no one was needy. People shared all that they had, even selling their houses and property and donating the proceeds to the apostles for the needs of all. The second reading is from St. John's First Letter and emphasizes the love of God for Jesus and all His followers,

and their love for God. This love is shown by obeying the Commandments. This love conquers the world through faith and belief that Jesus is the Son of God who came into the world for us. The Spirit of truth testifies to this reality.


St. John's Gospel tells of Jesus' appearance to the disciples and apostles who

were hiding from the Jews. Jesus comes to them and offers them peace. Then He shows them His hands and side so they can see His wounds and know it is really Jesus. Then Jesus sends them forth, breathing on them, giving them the Holy Spirit and the power to forgive sins. However, Thomas was not present and missed this great gift from the Risen Jesus. He protests that he must see Jesus' wounds and put his finger into the marks. A week later he has the opportunity when Jesus appears to them



again and invites Thomas to see and touch His wounds. Thomas proclaims, "My Lord and my God." Jesus says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." How do you respond to the Risen Jesus? Do you take Jesus at His word that we are blessed even without seeing? How do you witness daily to the

Risen Jesus?




