# Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

# Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24, 2023

This weekend is the Fourth Sunday of Advent, with the Christmas Vigil Mass at 4 PM Sunday afternoon and later in the evening is the Midnight Mass at midnight. As I have mentioned before, this 4<sup>th</sup> week is about 6 hours long! Hopefully you will be well prepared for our Christmas celebrations by Sunday afternoon! Merry Christmas!



Our Scriptures for this 4th Sunday bring to a conclusion our Advent preparation for Jesus' birth. Last week the focus of the readings was on John the Baptist; this week the focus is on Our Blessed Mother Mary. The first reading from Second Samuel tells us about King David who wanted to build a house (temple) for the Lord to live in. The prophet Nathan has a dream telling David not to build a house for the Lord. The Lord has been caring for His people for a long time. Now the Lord will build a house (progeny) for David, giving him heirs to make his kingdom secure, eventually resulting in the birth of Jesus through the obedience of Mary. In the second reading, St. Paul writes to the Romans regarding the prophetic writings which were fulfilled by the birth of Jesus, the Son of Mary, through the Holy Spirit. This reminder is to strengthen the

faith of the Romans and through them to bring Christ glory forever and ever.

Our Gospel reading from the first chapter of St. Luke's Gospel is once again the account of the Annunciation of Gabriel to the Virgin Mary. We had this same Gospel for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, and the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. Gabriel visits Mary who is betrothed to Joseph. Gabriel greets Mary as

"full of grace." Mary is troubled by this greeting, and wonders what it means. The Angel goes on to tell Mary that she has been chosen by God to be the mother of His Son, and Mary wonders how this will happen. Gabriel reassures her that the Holy Spirit will come upon her, and the child to be born will thus be the Son of God, to be named Jesus. Gabriel also reveals that Elizabeth, Mary's kinswoman, is 6 months pregnant and will bear a son in her old age, for nothing is impossible for God. Mary is convinced & declares that she is the "handmaid of the Lord," ready to be obedient to God's word. So we are once again called to recognize Mary's great faith & obedience, and we should do our best to follow Mary's example. How are we being called to obedience and commitment to the Lord's plans? What can we do this week and year to further God's plans in our family, in our Church, and in our world?
