

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 18, 2023


Happy Father's Day to all of our fathers, living and deceased. We are most grateful for our fathers and all they have done for us during our childhood and early lives. I'm especially grateful for my father, Fintan, who loved me and cared for me and my brothers and sisters and our Mom, Florence. He died at a young age, only

70, while I was stationed here in Oldenburg in 1977. Prior to my going to the seminary, my brothers and I worked with our Dad building a home each summer. Dad was a shop teacher in the Cincinnati Public Schools and then became a Junior High math and science teacher. I learned most of my construction skills from working with my Dad and my brothers each summer. We built at



least 18 houses during that time. Dad said he made more money in 3 months building a home and selling it, than he did teaching school the other 9 months each year! Dad taught me responsibility and good construction practices, and helped me learn to be independent and self-confident and to experience how a good and loving father loves and cares for his children and wife. I am truly blessed by my father and his example of self-less love and generosity.

Now that we are back in Ordinary Time once again, our Scriptures continue to speak to us about God's love for His people, and the sacrifices Jesus made for all of us to save us from our sins. Our first reading from Exodus describes God care for the



Israelites whom He led out of Egypt. He gave Moses the 10 Commandments of the Covenant for the people and made them His special possession, "a kingdom of priests, a holy nation." St. Paul writes to the Romans reminding them that Jesus died for them while they (and us) were still sinners. We were reconciled to God through Jesus' death, and are now saved by His life. St. Matthew's Gospel tells of Jesus' pity for the people who were like sheep without a shepherd.

Jesus goes on to appoint 12 disciples to be His apostles and sends them out to drive out unclean spirits and cure every disease. He sends them to the lost sheep of Israel, to give what they have received from Him. Are we aware of how much we have received from Jesus to share?

Thanks to all who joined us to celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi this past






