
Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections Sixth Sunday of Easter, May 14, 2023

Congratulations and Best Wishes to all of our Mothers, living and deceased. You are in our thoughts and prayers in a special way on this Mothers' Day 2023! We are glad to celebrate your love and special gifts to us this day and every day. We would not be here without you and your nurturing love. Much of what we have learned comes from you and your care for us. You have made us what we are and what we have to pass on to the



next generation. We will have a special blessing for all of our Mothers at Mass today, and the Knights of St. John will be serving their delicious breakfast/brunch for all of our Mothers and their families in the cafeteria on Sunday.

On this Sixth Sunday of Easter we continue to hear about the spread of the Good



News as the apostles and disciples travel to the other cities and places away from Jerusalem. Philip goes down to Samaria and proclaims Christ to them. Many people come to believe and there is great joy. Then the apostles in Jerusalem send Peter and John so that the new believers may also receive the Holy Spirit. The First Letter of Peter encourages believers to be ready to share reasons for hope, even if they are maligned.

Peter says it is better to suffer for doing good, than for doing evil, following the example of Jesus. St. John continues to present Jesus' farewell to the disciples at the Last Supper. Jesus challenges them to keep His Commandments so that they will receive another Advocate, the Spirit of Truth. Jesus will not leave them orphans; they will realize that He is in the Father and the disciples are in Jesus and Jesus is in them. Whoever loves Jesus will be loved by the Father. Do we believe that Jesus is in us?

My 4 day workshop at St. Francis Retreat House in Easton, PA, was a very powerful experience for us 32 friars from all 6 US Provinces. We had much input and discussion about how to improve our communications with each other, particularly in our own friaries. We learned many techniques for dealing with problems by




bringing about better appreciation of the other's feelings and histories. We also tackled many issues regarding finances and new financial policies, especially as we form one large province of Our Lady of Guadalupe later this year. All of us friars will have to learn new

> health care issues, insurance concerns, bill paying, and how to generate budgets and
