

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 13, 2022

As we are approaching the end of the Church year, our readings take on a different tone. This weekend the Prophet Malachi describes his vision of the coming of the

"Sun of Justice" at the end of the world. Then the proud and all evildoers will be done away with; but not those who fear and revere God's name. St. Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians speaks of St. Paul's work and ministry for the Thessalonians. He calls for them to imitate him and his work generously. Those who do not work should not eat! We are not to be busybodies nor conduct ourselves in a disorderly way! In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the end times when the Temple



will be destroyed. People ask what will be the signs that this destruction is about to happen. He says that there will be wars and insurrections, earthquakes and famines and plagues. And before that there will be trials and persecutions for believers. But Jesus promises to give them and us the wisdom and powerful testimony that can't be refuted. There will even be divisions in families and some will be put to death. But Jesus promises that by perseverance all will secure their lives. (The Temple was destroyed in 70 AD by the Romans); are we ready by faith to face new trials and persecutions in our troubled world and times?



Soon it will be Thanksgiving time and we will be celebrating with our families and friends all the gifts that God has given us. Even in the midst of trials and persecutions, we have been blessed in many ways, especially in this country. The many sad and tragic events happening in other parts of the world, such as the war in Ukraine, highlight our blessings and challenges. Jesus' gift of his Body and Blood that we are privileged to receive at Mass is certainly our greatest gift of all. May we grow in our appreciation of Jesus' gift!




