



Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 6, 2022

Our Scriptures for this weekend speak to us about the experiences of 7 brothers. The Second Book of Maccabees recounts the courage of the 7 brothers

who were martyred rather than eat pork against the Jewish law. They were ready to die, rather than transgress the laws of their ancestors. They died demonstrating their hope of being raised up by God. St. Paul writes to the Thessalonians encouraging them to be faithful in word and deed. He also asks for their prayers, to be delivered from perverse and wicked people who lack faith. He expresses his faith in the Lord's



protection. St. Luke's Gospel tells the story of some Sadducees who challenge Jesus with the bizarre example of 7 brothers who were all married in succession to the same woman, but who each died childless. They wondered who she would be married to after the resurrection. He says that in the age to come, there will be no marrying or giving in marriage. They will be like angels, because God is a God of the living, not of the dead. How do we understand what eternal life will be like for us if we remain faithful to our loving God?



I hope you all enjoyed All Hallows Eve (Halloween). Hopefully this celebration helped us prepare for All Saints Day and All Souls Day. During this first week of November and throughout the month, we remember those who have gone before us in the faith, celebrating their commitment to follow Jesus' teaching and example. We pray for our deceased, that they may enjoy

everlasting life with our loving God.

This coming Tuesday, November 8, is Election Day. We are all encouraged to exercise our civic duty to vote according to our Christian consciences for the most fitting candidates, not simply because of their party affiliation. No candidate or party is perfect, so we need to examine their records and principles



and have the good of the community, especially the poor and suffering, in mind when we vote.


