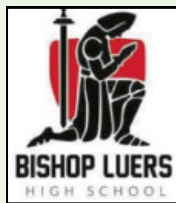

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 23, 2022

This weekend we have the annual election for our 4 new Parish Council members. Each parishioner 18 years of age and over is qualified to vote for no more than 4 candidates who will serve for the next 3 years, replacing the 4 Parish Council members who have completed their 3 year term. We want to thank these people who have served well on the Council: Carol Dobson, Karen Enneking, Darrin Moorman, and Bill Starost. Bill was our chairman, and Carol was our secretary. Ballots will be distributed and voting will take place after the homily.



I returned Sunday afternoon from Fort Wayne where I joined the Class of 1971 from Bishop Luers High School for their 50th reunion. I taught at Bishop Luers High School for the first 4 years after I was ordained. About 80 people participated in the reunion, mostly grads and some of their spouses. We gathered and partied on Saturday, after touring the huge Sweetwater Music Center. On Sunday I celebrated Mass with the group, and then we visited the high school to see all the changes in the last 50 years. A new chapel greeted us at the entrance of the school, and the Director of Development showed us all the renovated classrooms with their emphasis on technology and creativity. I hardly recognized the place; everything looked bigger, cleaner and more modern than I remembered.

The Scriptures for this week continue to remind us that God is just and merciful. The Book of Sirach tells us that God knows no favorites, but especially hears the cries of the poor widow and orphan. The Lord will judge justly and affirms the right. He will not delay. St. Paul continues his Letter to Timothy as he reflects on his ministry. He says he has completed the race and has kept the faith. God will reward his preaching to the Gentiles and bring him safely to heaven. In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about the Pharisee and the tax collector who went to the temple to pray. The Pharisee is self-righteous and brags about himself, while the tax collector simply admits his sinfulness. Jesus says the tax collector went home justified, but not so the Pharisee. Do we brag about our moral accomplishments like the Pharisee, or do we admit our basic sinfulness like the tax collector? What should God be hearing from us?



This weekend we also have a second collection for World Mission Sunday. This collection supports the many missionaries working to spread the Gospel in countries around the world, including Franciscan missionary priests and brothers. Please be generous.



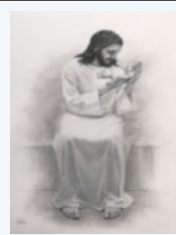

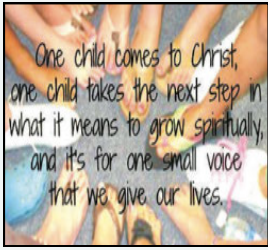
Jenny Ilderton: I look forward to working with Fr. Carl and the rest of the Council regarding any matters of the church and its ministries.

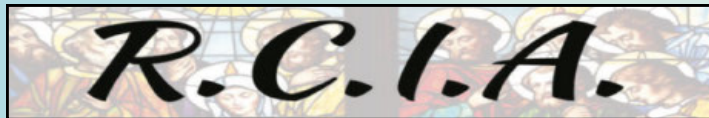

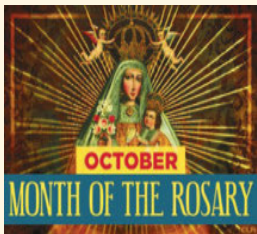

WHY PRAY THE ROSARY

First, we don't have to pray the rosary all at once. We can also choose to divide it up, saying just a decade or two at a time at different points throughout the day: on the way to work, in between errands, in between meetings, while folding laundry or doing dishes. Many holy men and women and even popes have prayed the rosary this way and have found it manageable and fruitful for their busy lives.

Second, we can pray it anywhere! The rosary is like a portable chapel we can keep in our pocket and pull out anytime, anyplace. Whether we have a sudden, urgent situation to present to God in prayer or we just want to fill some of our day with thoughts of God, all we need to do is pull out our beads and turn to the Lord in this prayer.

Third, we can pray the rosary in different ways, customizing it to fit the needs of the moment.

Sometimes we might focus on the words of the prayers, thinking, for example, of Gabriel's greeting to Our Lady as we slowly say with great devotion, "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." At other times, we might reflect on the mysteries of Christ's life, prayerfully contemplating scenes such as his birth in Bethlehem, his transfiguration, or his death on the cross, etching the Gospel on our hearts. At still other times, we might focus on the holy name of Jesus at the center of each Hail Mary, speaking his name tenderly with love as the pulse of our rosary.

Fourth, it's easy to fit the rosary into your schedule. Do you have two and-a-half minutes in your day that you can give to God? This is the beauty of the rosary. If I need a quick pause in my busy life—just a two-and-a-half-minute break—I can pull out my beads and pray a decade in order to regroup with the Lord and be nourished spiritually. That's all a decade takes: one Our Father, ten Hail Marys, and one Glory Be.

Fifth, even if I'm not able to give the rosary my full attention, it's still worth praying. I might not always be able to completely unplug mentally from the concerns of the day. Offering God a decade or two in the midst of my daily life gives him something beautiful, even if I give it without my full, relaxed, undivided attention. I'm giving God some space in my day and filling it with words of praise for him.

But the rosary can take us deeper—a lot deeper. When we pray the rosary in its ideal setting, doing a whole set of mysteries, the prayer can slow us down, calm our hearts, and enable us to rest in God's presence. It draws out the deepest desires in our souls, desires for God and God alone.
