Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 13, 2024

After celebrating the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord last weekend, and the Baptism of the Lord last Monday, we now move into Ordinary Time. The Christmas Season has ended and we soon will put away our Christmas decorations. Thanks to all who worked so hard to decorate our Church for our Christmas celebrations. We appreciate your generosity and skill and creativity once again this year! Thanks also to our musicians for your beautiful Christmas Season liturgical performances.

Our Scriptures for this Second Sunday in Ordinary Time describe God's continued action on behalf of His people. In our first reading from the Book of Samuel, we hear God calling to Samuel who is living in the Temple with Eli the priest. God calls Samuel

three times, and finally Eli gets the message: God wants Samuel to do God's special work. Samuel finally answers God's call: "Speak, for your servant is listening." second reading St. Paul reminds the Corinthians that we

are made for the Lord. God raised Jesus from the dead, and also will raise us up. So we are called to avoid evil and do good; our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit and are to be used to praise and glorify God.

John's Gospel passage describes two disciples of John the Baptist beginning to follow Jesus. They ask Jesus where He is staying, and Jesus says, "Come and see."



They stayed with Jesus that day. Andrew was one of the 2 disciples, and he brought his brother Simon to Jesus, telling him," We have found the Messiah!" welcomed Simon and changed his name to Cephas, translated "Peter," which means "Rock." We are being prepared for Peter, the Rock, to become the leader of the apostles. How do we answer the calls we receive from God? Do we say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is

listening?" Are we open and willing to do God's will, not simply our own? This new year is the perfect opportunity to renew our Baptismal commitment to follow Jesus! Our Parish Council met last Tuesday and continued to plan for the new year, and

to discuss what we need to do to maintain our vibrant and active parish. Many new families have joined us over the past year, and we

want to respond to their needs. Our new school boiler is being installed. We are still looking for applicants interested in replacing our Maintenance Man, Doug Nobbe, who is

retiring in April. Please see the Job Listing which is posted in the main vestibule of church.

Congratulations to Bro. John Barker who will be ordained to the Diaconate by Archbishop Charles Thompson this Saturday, Jan 20. We appreciate all that Bro. John has done for our parish since last February, and look forward to his additional ministry.




