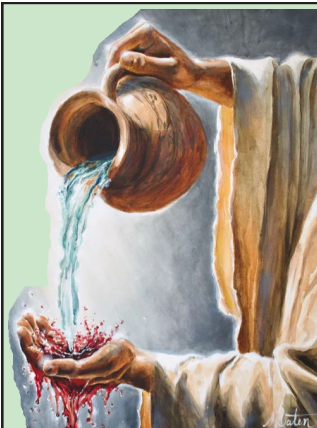

# Holy Family Parish



*You have kept the good wine until now...* (John 2:10)

In the Gospel according to John, Jesus' miracles are always called "signs," because they point to or reveal His divinity and the power of the Kingdom breaking into the world. These signs are Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead; walking on water; feeding the multitude with a few loaves and fish; healing the blind, the lame, and the near dead; and...turning water into wine. Compared to the other signs, that last one can seem so mundane, so trivial, even like a magic trick. But, of course, it's not.

Because they are signs, these miracles all have significance deeper than the surface facts. In the case of water turning into wine, we have to understand what a wedding and wine signify in Israel's prophetic tradition. In our first reading this week, Isaiah declares: "As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder will marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so shall your God rejoice in you." In many other places in the Old Testament, the relationship between God and His people is likened to a marriage. This metaphor carries over into the New Testament. In the Book of Revelation, for example, we find the Church as the bride in "the wedding feast of the Lamb" (19:7-9). And Jesus often compares the Kingdom of God to a wedding banquet. So, it's significant that Jesus' first "sign" occurs at a wedding banquet. Jesus at a wedding banquet signifies that He has come to establish the longed-for Kingdom, in which God and His people will celebrate their full reconciliation.

What about the wine? In the prophets we also find images of God's reign as a rich feast with an abundance of wine (Isaiah 5:6). The prophet Joel even tells us that one day "the mountains will drip new wine" (4:18). Jesus turns a lot of water into wine (180 gallons!!!), a sign not only of His divine power but also of the incredible generosity and joy to be found in the Kingdom Jesus has come inaugurate. The promise of Christmas Day begins to unfold in the life and ministry of Jesus, Who has come to bring not just abundant wine, but abundant, eternal, joyful life for all who want it.
