Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 11, 2024

Punxsutawney Phil did not see his shadow on Friday, so we are supposed to have an early Spring. That seems to be the case as we had 50 and 60 degree days this past week. Now we prepare for Mardi Gras on Tuesday and Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day on Wednesday of this week. The Church's Season of Lent begins for us. It is a season of penance and preparation for the great Paschal events of Holy Week and Easter.



This weekend's Scriptures are concerned about purity laws and being ritually clean. In the reading from Leviticus, the Lord gives a description of the diseases that make a person unclean. They call it "leprosy" but it can be any kind of skin disease. The unclean person had to stay outside the community until declared clean by the priest. They wore peculiar clothes and had to cry out, "Unclean, unclean!" and dwell apart from family and friends. In our second reading St. Paul continues to write to the Corinthians. He emphasizes that they should do everything for the glory of God and avoid offending others, whether Jew or Greek. St. Paul says they should do as he does, not seeking one's own benefit, but that of other people. His desire is that all may be saved by being imitators of Christ, loving God and each other, as they welcome the Gospel.



St. Mark's Gospel gives us the example of a person with leprosy coming to Jesus for healing. Jesus stretches out his hand and touches the person for healing. (Touching a sick person made the other ritually unclean, but Jesus was more concerned about healing the sick person so he could return to his family and community.) The person was to show himself to the priest for proof that he was healed, but

instead, the leper publicized the healing. As a result Jesus could not enter a town openly. Jesus did not want to be known simply as a healer, because His ministry was to proclaim the Reign of God. How do we approach Jesus when we are in need of healing? Are we concerned simply about ourselves, or do we want to give praise to God and extend God's Reign? How do we plan to promote God's kingdom of love and mercy on earth during this year's Season of Lent?

We congratulate Harper Irene Meyer, daughter of Logan and Haley (Litzinger) Meyer who was Baptized on Saturday, February 3, and another young girl who was Baptized on Sunday, February 4, 2024 at Holy Family Church. May they and their families grow in their love for each other, for God and for His people.

We offer our sympathy and the promise of our prayers to the family of Dick Hirt whose funeral Mass was held on Saturday, February 10, here at Holy Family Church. May he rest in peace and may his family and friends be consoled.

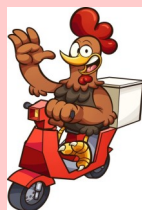


