

Nations shall walk by your light... (Isaiah 60:3)

The feast of Epiphany, as we celebrate it today, focuses on the coming of the Magi (wise men) or kings to pay homage to the "newborn king of the Jews." The emphasis is on the extension of the promises of God, given first to Abraham, to all nations, represented by these visitors from the east. Many times in the prophets, especially in Isaiah, the God of Israel promises that one day all nations will come to acknowledge, learn from,

and worship Him – to "walk by His light." It was through Christ that these promises were fulfilled. We need only look at the missionary success of Saint Paul, and the fast growth of the Church in the early centuries, to see how much the world longed to walk by the light of Christ. Undoubtedly, it still does.

The word *epiphany* means a revelation or manifestation of something extraordinarily important. This Sunday we celebrate the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, which obviously changed the course of world history. But traditionally Epiphany has also included two other extraordinary manifestations of Christ near the beginning of His earthly ministry: His Baptism in the Jordan and the turning of water into wine at the wedding of Cana. Nowadays we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord as a separate feast on the Sunday after Epiphany. And it so happens that this year the Gospel on the Sunday after that is about the wedding at Cana. So, for these three weekends you might say we are celebrating an extended Epiphany as we contemplate the ways that Christ reveals Himself as the Messiah and Beloved Son of the Father.

Epiphany is a time to celebrate Christ's coming into the world to bring us His divine life and to gather all of us into the household of God. Today Christ does not need any gold, frankincense, or myrrh. But He does want our hearts, our hands, and all the gifts He has given us to help Him spread the Good News of God's love for the whole world. What might you do this year to help Jesus become better known and loved in your little corner of the world?

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, *Pilgrims of Hope*, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.


May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth.
