

Fr. Carl's Thoughts and Reflections

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 21, 2024 This Saturday we had the wonderful experience of Bro. John Barker's ordination to the diaconate by Archbishop Thompson. Bro. John has been looking forward to this important step in his life as friar for several years, especially as he has been living & ministering with us friars here at Holy Family Church since last February. Now he will begin functioning regularly as a Deacon at our Sunday & weekday Masses. We are blessed to have Bro. John in our midst for this special time of new ministry.



Our Scripture readings for this Third Week in Ordinary Time feature preachers and prophets responding to the call of God and His Son Jesus. Our reading from



the Book of Jonah describes the second time God calls him. after Jonah first refused to do God's bidding and was swallowed by the big fish. This time he goes and preaches to the hated Ninevites, and they respond immediately to his words by repenting of their sinfulness. God is so impressed that He doesn't destroy them. In our second reading, St. Paul writes to the Corinthians warning them that the time is running out. They need to change their ways and repent of

their sins before this world passes away. St. Paul calls for drastic changes in their daily behavior as a sign of their repentance.

In St. Mark's Gospel we hear of the arrest and imprisonment of John the

Baptist. Jesus then goes to Galilee and proclaims the Gospel of God. People are called to repent because the Kingdom of God is at hand. Jesus passes by the Sea of Galilee & calls the fishermen Simon and Andrew to abandon their nets and their father, and become his disciples. Jesus does the same with the sons of Zebedee, James and John. They, too, followed Jesus as his disciples. The call of Jesus is powerful, and the fishermen respond immediately. How inclined are we to answer Jesus' call



in our lives? Are we willing to leave all behind and become Jesus' disciples? What does that mean for our daily lives as parishioners of Holy Family Church?

Thanks to all who worked hard to decorate our church for Christmas and for Bro. John's Ordination, and who do such a good job all year long. Please pray for



the Legal Protection of the Unborn, especially those gathered in Washington, DC., and throughout our nation on Monday. Also pray for the unity of Christians during this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, January 18-25. Pray also for those suffering from Covid and other diseases. We have much to be thankful for, and a lot of intentions to pray for during this month of January! God bless you all for your support and prayers!
